The U.S. Soccer **Development Academy** program provides Education, Resources, and Support to impact everyday club environments to Develop World-Class Players.








Academy's Key Principles


Talent Identification Pathway



- -National Team Coaches consult with Director of Talent ID, Technical Advisors, and USSF Scouts to identify and develop players within YNT pool
- -Director of Talent ID works with Technical Advisors to receive scouting information from each market on a weekly basis
- -Technical Advisors (TA) manage scouting networks, provide scouting reports and player-specific data to Director of Talent ID and YNT Staff
- -Talent Identification consists of USSF Scouts and collegiate coaches attending training, games, and showcases to identify elite talent
- -Development Academy offers platforms to showcase talent to those with direct access to Youth National Teams

Full-Time Players


- A fully committed player who is only competing within the Development Academy
- Consistent training and playing environment is important (guest playing not needed)
- Ability to play up based on:
 - Physical Development
 - Accelerated Learning
 - Challenging Game Environment

Developmental Players (DP)

- A DP is a high-potential player on a non-DA team within the club that is given consistent opportunities to train with the DA player pool
- DPs can play in a maximum of six (6) Academy games while also competing with their non-DA team
- DPs should have a customized Individual Development Plans (IDP) created by the club to project and maximize player growth
